

Who Can Register

- One **Kindergarten** registration form for **new to CBE students** that will include a question about alternative programs with branching questions if the answer is yes.
- One Grade 1-9 registration form for new to CBE students that will include a
 question about alternative programs with branching questions if the answer is
 yes.
- One Grade 1-9 alternative program expression of interest form for current CBE students.
- The expression of interest form includes:
 - parent email and phone number as contact info
 - a drop down menu to indicate the school the student currently attends

Transportation considerations

- K-5 yellow bus transportation provided following CBE congregated stop guidelines for alternative programs
- Parents pay an annual fee for CBE yellow bus service or purchase monthly Calgary Transit passes. Cost current year is \$130 for Kindergarten and grade 1-9 is \$260. *may change
- Congregated stops are reviewed annually and informed by preregistration for transportation, online through MyCBE/PowerSchool
- Congregated stops may not be within walking distance and alternate arrangements may be required to access the congregated stop
- Please note there is no mid-day bussing for Kindergarten students. Friday bussing is available both ways.

Blue Months - Child must be registered in Grade One.

Green Months - Child should be registered in Kindergarten*

Yellow Months - Child is eligible to start Kindergarten in 2025-2026 or 2026-2027 (later entry strongly encouraged)

Red Months - Cannot register as this child is too young (born after December 31, 2021 cutoff).

*Children born between September - December 2019 may register in Kindergarten or Grade One. We would strongly encourage children born during this time be registered in Kindergarten unless the child has prior ECS programming.

Kindergarten Readiness

Learn about the school:

- Take your child to the school playground (when available)
- Attend the school's kindergarten information session (when available)
- Review the school website and events

Build your child's independence by encouraging them to:

- Dress themselves (zippers, buttons)
- Use the bathroom and wash their hands on their own
- Put away toys and help out in other small ways at home
- Make age-appropriate choices and solve problems independently
- Introduce themselves to new similar aged friends when out and about

Kindergarten Readiness

Take time to talk with your child about everyday activities:

- Share special activities together, such as walks to the park
- Talk about what you are seeing and doing
- Talk, read, sing and play in your first language every day
- Praise children for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks
- Talk about how it is okay to make mistakes
- Build up to 3-step instructions at home: get dressed, brush your teeth, brush your hair

Kindergarten Readiness

Read to your child every day:

- Read stories together in your first language to help your child develop vocabulary, listening and speaking skills
- Enjoy reading different types of books: picture books, information books, nursery rhymes, poetry
- Encourage your child to talk about the pictures and stories as you read together, make predictions, ask follow up questions about what is happening in the story
- Visit your community library (when possible)

Kindergarten Readiness

Build your child's interest in literacy and numeracy:

- Make a game of looking for letters and numbers on community signs and in books
- Provide scissors and playdough to strengthen fine motor skills
- Provide opportunities for your child to draw with pencils, crayons and felt pens, use glue sticks
- Help your child print his or her first name, if they are interested
- If you are unsure about your child's milestone achievements, please be sure to discuss these with your family doctor
- Ensure your child has had a recent hearing test if you have concerns and an eye exam within the last year
